That has its models also in design. I can think of I can think of the historical Italian Renaissance schools of design with the studio head, who has the vision and everyone works to it. That is still a dominant model in many places today. I'm not convinced by that, and I would prefer to see a distribution of control amongst the different people who participate in different ways.
